

Peacebuilding



About the project

We are supporting

teenage girls and young mothers in Africa

We aim to support teenage pregnant girls and young mothers in Africa, providing them with access to education, healthcare, and economic empowerment opportunities. The project seeks to reduce the stigma associated with teenage pregnancy, promote gender equality, and improve the overall well-being of young mothers and their children in Africa

Our objectives

- Reduce the stigma associated with teenage pregnancy across six target countries.
- Equip 600 teenage girls and young mothers (100 per country) with education, healthcare access, and skills for economic empowerment.
- Build partnerships with local governments, schools, and healthcare providers to offer long-term support to young mothers.


Our objective is to support 600 teenage pregnant girls and young mothers in Africa, providing them with access to education, healthcare, and economic empowerment opportunities while reducing the stigma around teenage pregnancy.







Program Timeline: From Beneficiary Identification to Program Wrap-Up



Stakeholder Engagement (October-November 2024)

Establish partnerships with local governments, schools, and healthcare providers.

Identify potential local organizations and NGOs for collaboration in each country.

Seek funding from potential donors for project

Beneficiary Identification (November-December 2024)

Organize a rally or compaign to distribute educational materials for young mothers.

Target and reach at least 50 young mothers per country through grassroots organizations.

Launch awareness campaigns in each country to

Baseline Assessment (January-February 2025)

Conduct initial surveys to assess participants' current education, health, and financial situations.

Identify key needs and challenges and categorize teenagers based on the assessment.

Develop training materials following the baseline assessment report.

Training Programs Begin (February-March 2025)

Launch monthly educational programs focused on vocational training, entrepreneurship, and financial literacy.

Partner with healthcare providers for monthly checkups and mental health support.

Organize campaigns to reach more young mothers and increase participation to 100 per country.

Support for Teenage Girls/Young Mothers

Provide education, health, and economic empowerment support to 600 teenage girls/young mothers across six countries.

Monthly Virtual Mentorship

Conduct monthly virtual mentorship workshops for program participants.

Collaboration with Local Partners

Collaborate with local partners to ensure longterm program sustainability.

Micro-Grants or Seed Funding

Offer micro-grants or seed funding to selected 60 teenage girls/young mothers at the project close-out ceremony.




AYLF YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM (AYMHP) – MALAWI

Mental health according to World Health Organization is referred to the capacity of thought, emotion, and behavior that enables every individual to realize their own potential in relation to their developmental stage, to cope with the normal stresses of life, to study or work productively and fruitfully, and to contribute to their community". (World Health Organization, 2004). From this definition, it is imperative to note that mental health is not a one stage in life kind of scenario but rather something someone grows with over passage of time and can affect so many areas of one's life if not well managed.

This concept note therefore seeks to find ways of navigating through this challenge which has ravaged Malawi claiming more productive lives. According to police reports, suicide rates in Malawi jumped from 128 in a space of 5 years and that was from 2018 to 2022, and this number has grown even more from that date. In 2023 alone and first half of the year, 256 people had died from suicide related cases, and this is alarming because most of these are young productive minds. For a productive society and contribution to national development, Malawi needs a generation of young people who are mentally stable, and this must start being looked at from a young age.

An impactful way of achieving any result is to cut the cause of any problem from the root and not fruits and the trend has been to address issues of mental health when one is already grown but this initiative seeks to start dealing with the cause from root up. African Young Leaders Foundation-Malawi chapter intends to undertake this initiative as a pilot project using social media and in selected schools from the Southern region of Malawi and scale it up to other parts of the country. The chapter intends to roll out the initiative for a period of 6 months beginning November 2024- April 2025 and the name of the project shall be called Youth Mental Health Program (YMHP).

Objective

Modus Operandi

Bi-Weekly virtual and quarterly in-person dialogues, featuring:

- 1. Keynote speakers: Renowned African thought leaders, experts, and innovators;
- 2. Panel discussions: Interactive sessions with diverse youth perspectives;
- 3. Breakout sessions: Small-group discussions and idea-generation; and
- 4. Networking: Opportunities for connection and collaboration.

Themes: Each dialogue will focus on a specific theme, such as:

- 1. Education and skills development
- 2. Entrepreneurship and economic empowerment
- 3. Leadership and governance
- 4. Social justice and activism
- 5. Technology and innovation
- 6. Social impact activities

Target Audience

Young Africans aged 18-40, including students, professionals, entrepreneurs, and social activists.

Projected Outcomes



AYLF PAN-AFRICAN DEBATE CHAMPIONSHIP 2025

Theme: "Empowering African Youth to Shape Solutions for Sustainable Development"

Brief Summary

The African Young Leaders' Foundation (AYLF) Debate Competition is designed to harness the intellectual power of young African leaders by providing them with a platform to debate key societal issues affecting Africa. This debate competition focuses on solving real-world challenges through critical thinking and Pan-African collaboration. 
AYLF - AFRICAN YOUNG LEADERS FOUNDATION: PAST ACTIVITIES


The AYLF Teenage Pregnancy Prevention and Support Program (AYLF TPPSP)






International Day of Peace Online Conference
